## **HOW DID YOU DO? THIS IS THE CORRECT PRINT!**



### **STEPS TO OBTAINING A GOOD QUALITY THUMBPRINT**

1. Use an ink pad\* designed for taking fingerprints. Please do not use a regular stamp pad as these do not work well for comparison purposes.
2. A “rolled” thumbprint, as recorded in a full set of inked fingerprints, is not required on forms with limited space. A plain impression is adequate for comparison purposes.
3. Please be sure the thumbprint\*\* is placed on a plain white background. If the surface is not white, please take the print on a

retab.\* Any watermarks, writing, or other markings could hamper an identification.

4. Using medium pressure, place the right thumb on the ink pad and lift straight up. Using the same amount of pressure, place the thumb on the document and lift straight up. This will help prevent smearing or smudging of the thumbprint.
5. If the thumbprint does not look similar in quality to the “correct print,” retake the print on a retab and place it over the poor quality print.
